

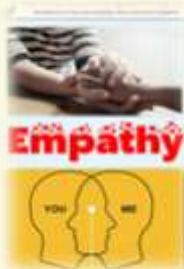

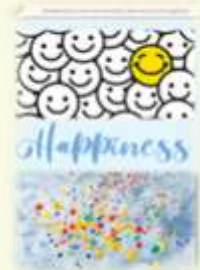

LENT SEASON PART 3



This week we will be looking at staying focused on Christ. Today's world is filled with so many issues and distractions. Distractions which at times can make us unfruitful and ineffective. Even in our own lives, we encounter so many distractions, to the point that at times it takes our focus away from the important things of life. Jesus Christ, all through His ministry here on earth, would say again and again to his disciples. I do that which I hear the father says. In John 5:19 He says

“ Verily, verily, I say unto you, The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he seeth the Father do: for what things soever he doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise.”

Question: How could he do this?

Answer: Because he kept his focus on God at all times. Jesus would often retreat from the people around him and from his disciples to spend time with the God our Father, just to know and hear what is on the father's heart for his assignment. Let us briefly explore four benefits of staying focused on Christ especially during this season of Lent, and beyond:

Perfect Peace:

When we keep our focus on Christ, no matter what storms come our way, we will be able to stand. When Peter saw Jesus walk on water, he said in Matthew 14:28 And Peter answered him and said, “Lord, if it be thou, bid me come unto thee on the water.” and the Lord stretched his hands out and Peter began to walk on water, but the moment he took his focus away from Christ, he began to sink and cried out to Jesus. This tells us that when we focus on Christ, no matter the storms of life, we will be able to stand, but when we remove our focus on Christ, and let the enemy distract us, we lose all sense of direction and begin to do things in our own strength.

True Unity: Jesus will always say, **“I and my father are one”**. In the book of John Chapters 14 –17 which I call the valedictory speech, here we see the true unity between Christ and the Father. If we focus on God, our relationship will be one of truth and honesty, because God is true.

Spiritual Stability: The reason why Christ was unwavering in his assignment was due to his spiritual stability with God and in God . He spent quality time with God in prayer. This made him strong spiritually , hence he was able to confront and principalities and powers.

Effectiveness: Staying focused on God means you will be effective, achieve more because you will be directed by God. Psalm 37:23 **“The steps of the righteous are ordered by God”**
