

Misleading App and Game Age Ratings

For some time it has been well known that age ratings within app stores, such as Apple Store and Google Play have been misleading and don't reflect that actual age requirements of the app or the game available to download. For example, in the Google Play store

WhatsApp is rated at PEGI 3, which cannot be the case as it is not a game! Not only is this confusing for parents, it can also be very confusing for younger children who may think they can download and use the app.
